

STEPS OF CLEANING QUARTZ COUNTERTOPS

Although quartz is resistant against stains of many liquids, acidic or alcoholic contents can still be risky if you let them dry on the surface. So, you should immediately clean wine, vinegar, soda, lemon, and other juices before they get dried. Try wiping the surface with a soft wet cloth first. If it doesn't help, use a little bit of dishwashing detergent and gently rub the surface.

If the spill or stain has already dried, a nonabrasive sponge can help you to scrape off the stain. Make sure that the sponge is a soft one like the ones for nonstick pans. If the stain goes away, it is fine.

However, some stains might be tough as they have stayed on the surface for a long time. It may be hard to deal with them, but we can still advise you of the following steps:

Step-1 Scraping Off



If there is a hard dried stain on your quartz countertop, the first thing you should do is to scrape off the stain peel on the surface. It will ease your job for the following steps. However, this scraping should be executed gently; otherwise, you might scratch your countertop.

In order to do it gently without damaging the countertop surface, you need an adhesive remover. You can apply the cleaner to the stain and wait for a few minutes. Then you can wipe the surface with some warm water and a soft cloth.

Once you get rid of the hard layer on the stain, the next thing is to clean the leftover on the surface. To this end, you can use isopropyl rubbing alcohol and a rag to rub the surface. This will make your surface clean and shiny again, but you should remember that the alcohol on the surface can damage your quartz countertop, so you should rinse the surface with some warm water after all.

Step-3 Deep Cleaning



Step-1 and step-2 are normally enough for you to bring your quartz countertop to its former state. However, if this sort of stain happens to your countertop frequently, you might want to do a deep cleaning when possible. To this intent, you can use special quartz cleaners or glass cleaners. Let the cleaner sit on the surface for a few minutes, and then wipe it with a soft wet cloth. That's it!
